### **Intended Audience**

The intended audience of this message is the public, providers, and veterinarians responsible for or involved in the submission of animal specimens for Rabies Testing at SHL.

### **Purpose of this Message**

To ensure that individuals are aware of an increased fee for Rabies Testing when there was no human exposure or exposure occurred out of provocation of the animal.

# Background

In 2024, SHL began charging a \$25 fee for non-human exposure rabies testing. Effective February 10, 2025 the State Hygienic Laboratory will increase the fee for non-human exposure rabies testing from \$25 to \$50 per specimen. This increase is necessary to cover the expenses incurred in rabies testing. This \$50 testing fee will additionally be applied to specimens where an animal bite occurred out of provocation. As always, when there is a human exposure without provocation, there is no charge for testing at SHL.

## Action Item

All submitters should review the Rabies Collection Instructions to ensure specimen integrity is maintained and the sample is properly packaged. Live bats must be hand delivered to the Coralville Laboratory in an air-tight, hard sided container.
